**A brief history : the abbey.** The village grew up around the abbey, the fine remains of which can still be seen. A basilica existed on the site in the 6<sup>th</sup> century, built where the Christian martyr Maurin was buried. The later abbey church was consecrated in 1097, as revealed in the text engraved on the walls of the south transept. At this time it was affiliated to the Order of Cluny. Two of six remaining capitals in the vaulted choir tell the story of the beheading and cephalory (carrying of his head) of Saint Maurin. The abbey grew steadily wealthier during the 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> centuries, which aroused the covetousness of various neighbours, and it was sacked several times. Around 1500 the abbey château was built, followed by a slow restoration of the abbey, which continued until 1645. However, the abbey's power and influence was on the wane, and by the time of the Revolution in 1789 only four monks remained. The last abbot, Joseph de Gallard de Saldebru, fled the revolutionaries to Bordeaux, but was recognised there and guillotined in 1794.

In 1796 the abbey buildings, now national property, were sold. Some became municipal buildings, while others were treated as stone quarries.

Today there is an ethnographic museum housed in the two cellars of the abbey château, dedicated to the traditions of the people of Saint-Maurin. The exhibits record and reveal the work and life of the villagers, especially that of the artisans and farmers from the beginning of the 20<sup>th</sup> century.
